This group has done a fantastic job standardising our national tournaments and creating safe and fair competitive environments for our athletes. They also helped IJRU this summer at the World Championships and have passed on their knowledge to help improve our tournaments moving forward.

This year, we tragically lost one of our members, Taylor Eleniak. The rope skipping community in Canada came together to support Nicola and the Eleniak family through this difficult time. There was an outpouring of support as athletes posted videos with the hashtag #TJforTaylor. We will continue to do our best to honour Taylor's memory and Rope Skipping Canada has instituted a new award at Nationals in Taylor's name.

As we look toward the 2024 season, we plan to shift our focus to building out processes to help raise the competitive level within Canada and work towards sport recognition.
